J.M. ATHERTON HIGH SCHOOL HISTORY

One of the oldest public high schools in Louisville, J.M. Atherton was built in 1923 as an all-girls school on the south side of Morton Avenue at Rubel Avenue, and opened its doors Monday morning, January 28, 1924.

With a staff of 32 teachers, 26 classrooms, a dean of girls, and 746 female students, Emma J. Woerner was its first principal.

Originally called J. M.
Atherton High School for
Girls (until it became
coeducational), Miss
Woerner saw to it that no
boy entered its portals to
"distract the attention of



the young ladies from their work at hand."

The school was named in honor of John McDougal Atherton, a local businessman, chair of the Educational Committee of the Louisville Board of Trade and a politician instrumental in changing Louisville's school system administration from trustees to a board of



education. The
Board of Education in
1921 suspended the
rule forbidding the
name of a school
after a living person
and named the new

proposed school after Mr. Atherton in appreciation for his work in public education.

In 1950, with all the area schools becoming coed, Atherton admitted male students, and in 1962 relocated to its present location on Dundee Road. The two-story building was constructed on a 49 acre site that was the Woodleigh estate of Charles and Ray Clagget.


ATHERTON ALUMNI SCHOLARSHIP AWARD


